



GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Each artwork submission must identify a teacher sponsor, who will support the student's submission efforts. Artwork can be submitted via USPS or via e-mail.
- 2. Art must be drawn on 8.5" X 11" WHITE poster board or WHITE drawing paper, with a one-inch white or blank border left on all four sides of the art, resulting in a final illustrated surface area of 6.5" X 9". Oversized and undersized artwork, as well as artwork without a one-inch border will not be accepted. See example on this page.
- 3. Artwork must be created by the student only and be age appropriate. No assistance from family members or friends is permitted.
- 4. Artwork must be drawn horizontally. Vertical artwork will not be accepted.
- 5. Artwork should depict water conservation behavior or wise water use:
 - a. inside or outside of the home or school
 - b. in industries or businesses
 - c. in the environment
 - d. in agriculture
 - e. in recreation

MAILED SUBMISSIONS


- 1. Mailed artwork must be sent in a flat, sturdy box or package. Please do not roll artwork into tubes or fold artwork since this damages entries for framing and reproduction purposes.
- 2. Each submitted entry MUST have a completed and signed entry form by parents/guardians taped or glued to the back of the artwork.

E-MAILED SUBMISSIONS

- E-mailed artwork must be scanned at a high quality resolution (original photo size, 2MB or 300 dpi). Guardians/teachers may e-mail artwork submissions to janela@westbasin.org. Keep physical submissions until April 2022; in case it's chosen as a winner!
- 2. Each e-mailed entry MUST have a completed and signed entry form by parents/guardians attached to the submission e-mail.

- 6. "Water is Life" is the theme. A short water awareness or water conservation phrase must be written on the artwork (but not necessarily "Water is Life").
- 7. Words must be spelled correctly. Please check spelling and punctuation. Incorrect grammar or spelling will be disqualified.
- 8. Students may use the following art media: crayons, markers, pencils, paints, watercolors, chalks, cut paper or fabric. No photography or computer-generated artwork is permitted.
- 9. Artwork must be ORIGINAL (no traced, trademarked, or copyrighted characters and slogans, e.g. Mickey Mouse, Sponge Bob, etc.). Also, no copy cat ideas of artwork from past years is allowed.
- 10. A participating student may win only one prize once in elementary school, once in middle school, and once in high school.
- Immediate family members (children or grandchildren) of agency employees and contest sponsors are not eligible to participate.
- 12. One one piece of art may be submitted for each student artist.

HELPFUL TIPS

What makes an award winning art piece?

BETTER!

Legible Font

Keep the water slogan brief, using a type font that is LARGE and simple.

Strong Slogan

Ensure a strong water slogan that demonstrates the student's understanding of the importance of water and/or the need to practice wise water use.

Simplified Artwork

Keep illustration simple and characters large. Reproduced artwork will be reduced to smaller scale for promotional purposes.

Color Contrast

Encourage student artist to use media that provides consistent, broad coverage in bright, bold, rich colors. If crayons are used, the artist must press hard on the paper for dark, rich colors. Pastels do not reproduce well.

1-Inch Border

Ensure a 1-inch border around artwork to allow framing. Many award quality art submissions have been rejected because the border was missing.
